THOUGHTS ON ABOLITION

in Issue 30, we asked for your thoughts and feelings after reading the article on prison abolition. We asked if there was anything you felt excited about, anything that scared you, and what questions came up for you.

Lunaiya: In today's society, especially in the Western parts of the world in which we reside, the Penal System is flawed and entirely dysfunctional. This isn't about Rehabilitation, isolating and controlling the problem, or even instituting better, more practical ways of righting the populace. It's an Us v. Them mentality. Mental Health, sexuality, racial and social backgrounds are used as weapons. Abolition offer POV change: A non-linear way of looking at how to better our situation. I believe in a time of change such as now, it is imperative we all act to push for this. People sometimes do bad things, however, we look at the end result, not the Root. In greek mythology, Hercules fought a Hydra. Each time a head was cut, two more took its place, that's where we are, like his solution, we get to the bottom and burn the stumps to better perceive a more useful and otherwise effective, solution.

Kelly @ Albion: At first I was not really interested in the idea. But I read it anyway. I was shocked at how fast I understood the movement for someone who never heard of or thought of such ideas. Being on the inside, I fully understand how human warehousing for profit and just throwing human lives away is one of mankind's worst inventions. This is money wasted, but the profiteers keep this waste of tax dollars under wraps. The same money should go to schools, senior citizens, social-services and continuing smart criminal justice and rehabilitation. Instead it goes draconian punishment, psychological damage and they say it creates jobs when they build another prison that will treat humans in conditions that would be illegal to do to animals.

Juicy Queen Bee: As a true believer and political prisoner I believe change starts with us. I'm all for starting a movement and I'm all for standing up for what's right, never giving up, never backing down from challenges that will come and test your faith and your strength.

Anonymous: I have to say yes and no about prison abolition. I think that people who have drug problems and people who are mentally ill should not ever be locked up. But people who do real morbid evil things should be locked up. However I am 110% anti death penalty no matter how bad the crime is that someone committed. No one should ever be put to death.

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ABOLITION, CONTINUED

CPS Simpson LM4751 @ Coal Township: During my incarceration I have experienced a mental and psychological coldness that has dehumanized me in many ways. The P.I.C. is so completely detached from reality that the very thought of rehabilitation is ridiculous to the point that it will leave you scratching your head questioning “did they really think that will work?” Can you imagine an individual who commits a serious offense, from the very beginning confessing and taking full responsibility for their actions, the way the system is now. The District Attorney would take them to trial, the prosecutor would request the maximum penalty and the lawyer or public defender would be begging for a deal on a slam dunk case for the state. In short you would spend years in prison, thank you for your honesty. There is no room for empathy when you’re fighting for your life, you will be taken from all you love, condemned to a concrete box and over time forgotten. But worse yet the PIC has created a hole in the family structure that has proven time and time again to end in the demise of more loved ones. We must overhaul the entire system. From the Beginning, What does that look like?

“You’re a victim of a crime you call an emergency # let’s call it 911, someone answers it’s a dispatcher you tell the dispatcher the problem but the dispatcher sends the police then transfers you to a trained psychologist who understands emotional cues they stay on the line with you while the dispatcher sends the police, the police show up but they are in plain clothing identified only by their badge they are also trained in cultural competency, ethics, social work & communication skills, and what they don’t have are guns with live rounds, just a range of immobilizing devices. You recognize the officers because they live in the community, they are involved everyday people. Immediately you’re calm, everything is calm, the families of both the victim and the person committing the crime are called. Intervention starts on the scene.”

I can imagine an arrest like the one above. I can see facilities throughout the whole world built for holistic care, ones that are equipped to care for psychological, spiritual, emotional and physical needs, each live-in a facility with the expertise to care for and repair lives. Truth be told this is not a dream, this could be a reality all it takes is effort and the willingness to see that the better we as a whole make people the better off the entirety of humanity. The world wants so badly for crime to decrease for criminals to be productive, this will only happen if we decrease poverty, increase education, reject systemic classism, racism, sexism and genderphobia, destroy economic disparity and abolish the P.I.C. How? You might ask “you’re all problems and no solutions” you might say, well I can tell you where to start, look in the mirror and begin to see everyone as a part of you.

Lexi Love: The idea of abolition is an exciting one, but sadly... it's just an idea, a "political vision." When will the vision become a reality? I've been an abolitionist before I even knew the word. I've never believed in prison. I don't believe it serves a purpose except to cause more harm. There has to be a better way. If we stop sitting around and talking about it, and put it into action, I believe we can virtually eliminate the prison industrial complex. Recently I've been taking a course on Restorative Justice (shoutout to our friends at Books Through Bars- Philly for providing the course). Restorative Justice is focused on repairing harm rather than punishing wrongdoers. I believe that combining Restorative Justice with PIC Abolition in practice, not just in theory, will better our lives and our nation for future generations.

Taz: I would like to think in 10 years that everyone will be treated the same white, black, asian and spanish. All lives matter.

Michelle: As you ask about abolition, but here and there are real such things? I have been in prison in Texas for going on 30 years.

If things change for us in Texas, we might gain insight into what could be boundless possibilities: a better relationship with staff and parole board and a good sense of understanding with transgenders that are sitting in prison and on the outside. I for one would like to see changes...putting us in prison is not the answer, or just throwing us around either! I have been a

transgender all my life and it's been 62 years hidden until the last 4 years, and I won't trade it all! I would love to hear ideas that may transform better relationships within Texas and the world to restore real people's lives. Because every life can count and we can work to better ourselves for the children of tomorrow's collective minds!

Egypt Ily Moore | MP7734 @ SCI Benner: Abolition is the action or act of abolishing a system or institution. An abolitionist is a person who favors the abolition of a practice or institution, esp. capital punishment or slavery.

What I imagine for myself and the rest of the world is what we've imagined for years - to be accepted equally regardless of gender, sexuality, race or any other lifestyle. I would like to see and I imagine this all the time within institutions and especially here on the Residential Treatment Unit (RTU). Guards are not trained to work with transgender people or other inmates on this unit. Discrimination is everywhere, not just here within these walls. I imagine once I get released I can keep fighting for my peers that are still here behind these walls. However I'll keep the fight alive on the streets letting the public know that discrimination is strong behind these walls between the LGBTQA community and guards - and that it needs to change.

What makes me excited is that our voices are finally being heard. What scares me is worrying about the retaliation from guards and higher for grievances I've written for my peers being discriminated against. Will they move me away from my peers? Will they plant something in my cell? However, I am ready for war.

Questions I have are: What can we do to make sure our voices are being heard about what is going on behind these walls? Who is our outside help, such as reliable sources if our families can't help us 'cause they don't approve of our identity? I'm excited to be a voice on the inside for the community. I love all of my brothers and sisters, known and unknown. I will continue to fight the good fight - not just here, but everywhere.

GETTING THINGS STARTED

Mrs. Gege, LIGHT Coalition

Hearts has heard from a number of energetic young trans folks seeking support and advice on starting mutual support organizations in their PA DOC facilities. We asked Mrs. GeGe to explain the steps she took to successfully navigate getting her organization, LIGHT, off the ground

How to start a support organization: This article explains how to start an official "inmate" organization in PA DOC.

The first thing is to get your numbers up. Create a list of members but don't collect signatures in case the administration thinks you're doing a petition. Don't do a petition because this is against policy and you'll go to the RHU for that.

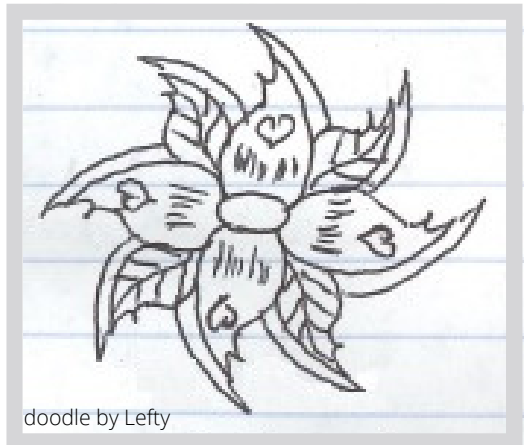
Okay now to also create membership you'll want to reach out to organizations and community members and see if they can help. They will be the backbone of your organization. Find a staff member to be the facilitator of this organization. They will be the liaison between you, the administration and the outside collective of your organization.

Once we have all that we can begin. You start by deciding how your organization will operate and how the leadership will look, (i.e. President, vice President, Treasurer, etc.) Then, you need to create a Yearly Plan of Action. This is a lot of things that I can't really tell you how to create but if there is another organization in the prison you can request a copy from them. This is important. It will include bylaws, meetings schedule and location, fundraising, fund usage and allocation, membership, body of leadership, etc. just use their organization's yearly plan of action as an example and then create your version.

Once you have this typed up you want to make several copies. I would suggest one for each member and one for the warden and one for the PCM. Also give one to the organization's facilitator.

Send the copies to the warden and the PCM with a DC-135A (request slip) asking them to consider this, that way you have a record.

If they deny this don't sweat it just try again or file a grievance. You can propose the organization once a year so don't give up. It might help if you file a grievance claiming discrimination. Good luck...



How to start a support group: This is different than an organization. A support group is a place to talk amongst peers and help each other.

To begin you'll want to talk to your peers and see if they would be interested. You should also talk to staff about this. Try to find staff that are open-minded like psychology staff perhaps. You need to find a staff member who would run the group.

Now you have your numbers. Next, you want to write to as many organizations and community members and ask them for some help. Now you're ready to send requests to the warden, PCM, and psychology department. At the same time, you want all of your supporters to call in and ask that the group be started. Also, get your peers to send requests to the warden, PCM and psychology department asking for the same thing. This is called applying pressure. You want to cover all avenues. just keep on applying pressure.

Now you've done all that and they still deny you? Don't sweat it. I was denied several times but after all the pressure they finally gave us the group.

ALL ABOUT ESTROGEN & 'MONING

what is estrogen?

Estrogen is the hormone responsible for the development of female secondary sex characteristics. In trans women's communities, taking estrogen is sometimes called 'moning, Hormone Replacement Therapy (HRT), or medical transition. Estrogen comes in pill, patch, or injection (shot) forms.

also sometimes part of medical transition:

Anti-androgens (testosterone/T-blockers) lower overall testosterone level. Used with estrogen to speed up effects. Sometimes used alone to delay puberty in trans girls.

estrogen works best if you are drinking lots of water

Progesterone is a pregnancy hormone that may have some effect on breast development. Opinions are mixed on whether progesterone is necessary to transition, it may even work against feminization. Some folks take **Vitamin B** either with their hormone shot or in a pill. While there is no evidence that this is necessary for transition, it does no harm and contributes to feeling energized and happy. **Vitamin E** pills or cream soften skin.

making smart decisions about black/grey market 'mones

Whether its from the internet or an underground provider, go to a source whose reputation is known in your community. Sharing needles or vials puts you at risk for HIV and Hep C transmission/infection. If you go to someone for an injection, if you don't **SEE** the needle come out of the package there is risk.

hormones from a doctor

There are **no regulations** or laws about whether a doctor can prescribe hormones; it's up to the doctor – a free market. You may have heard about doctors requiring patients to have years of psychotherapy before they will provide hormones. **They do not have to do this!** The current standard of care in LGBT health centers and progressive doctors is **informed consent** which means people are prescribed hormones as long as they fully understand what the hormones do.

advantages of going to a doctor

- you know for sure what you are getting
- hormones by prescription are cheaper, even if you have to pay cash.
- sometimes, insurance will pay for prescribed 'mones.
- a doctor overseeing your medical transition will periodically run blood tests for estrogen levels and liver function
- if you take any prescribed medication it may interact with 'mones. You should talk to your doctor about this.
- prisons are more likely to maintain you on hormones if they are prescribed by a doctor.

HIV meds affect estrogen: transition is slowed. However, estrogen does not impact the effectiveness of HIV meds.

what you can expect if you start 'moning

body

- breast buds develop 2-6 months after starting estrogen
- nipples will grow more sensitive over time
- breasts take several years to fully develop, generally to a similar size to cis female relatives
- body fat decreases in stomach, increases in thighs and butt
- overall decrease in muscle mass
- estrogen will give you body even if you've had silicone work done
- breasts are permanent, even if you stop 'moning
- fat and muscle changes are not permanent

everyone with breasts should screen routinely for breast cancer. Learn how to give yourself a monthly self-exam, and get an annual breast exam from your doctor.

softness

- thin layer of fat under the skin fills in the face
- skin will become softer
- facial hair may become lighter and thinner (but it will not go away)
- body hair growth will slow down, and hair may become finer and lighter
- if you stop 'moning these changes will reverse

what estrogen won't do

- estrogen will not raise voice pitch
- adam's apple will not shrink
- lost hair won't regrow
- 'mones will not grow a vagina, uterus or ovaries
- you will not get a cycle (menstruate)

emotion

- many trans women report a range of emotional effects from 'moning, like mood swings and crying easily
- some trans women experience "estrogen serenity" a feeling of well-being, calmness, and peace, while others experience depression
- emotional changes from 'mones are temporary

sex & genitals

- over time, estrogen can change sex drive and the way orgasm feels
- after years on estrogen, testicles, penis and prostate may decrease in size
- if you are over 50 you should still get an annual prostate exam
- eventually, erections may not be hard enough for penetrative sex
- estrogen lowers sperm count, but it may still be possible to make someone pregnant
- these effects may go away if estrogen is stopped

side effects

- for the first few months of estrogen therapy, many experience nausea similar to morning sickness in pregnancy
- risk of blot-clots and high blood pressure may be increased by estrogen
- liver function is affected.

how much is too much?

Everyone's body and genetic makeup is different. The right dose for someone else might not be right for you. Taking more estrogen than your body can process increases the risk of side effects and does not speed up transition.

ALL ABOUT TESTOSTERONE

what is testosterone?

testosterone is the hormone responsible for the development of male secondary sex characteristics. In transmale communities, testosterone is sometimes called T, and taking it is sometimes called Hormone Replacement Therapy (HRT), or medical transition. Testosterone comes in patch, injection (shot), gel, and cream forms.

oral testosterone is not effective for masculinizing and brings risk of side effects to dangerous levels.

Do not use T pills.

a note about steroids:

Some trans guys take steroids (sometimes called estrogen blockers, pro-hormones, HGH, or winnies) to alter their bodies, with mixed results. These products do not all have masculinizing effects and many come with serious side effects. If you use steroids, do your research carefully. Do not rely solely on information from the seller.

making smart decisions about black/grey market hormones:

- whether its from the internet or an underground provider, go to a source whose reputation is known among your friends
- sharing needles puts you at risk for HIV and Hep C transmission/infection
- if you are sharing a vial and “double dipping,” there is a risk of HIV and Hep C transmission/infection
- if you go to someone for an injection, if you don't SEE the needle come out of the package there is risk
- unlike estrogen, testosterone is a Class C substance, like cocaine: the purchase, possession, and distribution of T carries stiff sentences

advantages of going to a doctor:

- you know for sure what you are getting
- hormones by prescription are cheaper than those available on the black/grey market even if you have to pay cash.
- sometimes, insurance will pay for prescribed hormones. Ask your doctor (or your employer if insurance is through employer).
- if a doctor is overseeing your medical transition, they will periodically run blood tests to check your testosterone levels and liver function.
- if you take any prescribed medication it may interact with T. You should talk to your doctor about this.
- if you get locked up, prisons are more likely to maintain you on hormones if they are prescribed by a doctor.

HIV meds affect testosterone: transition is slowed. However, T does not impact the effectiveness of HIV meds.

what you can expect if you start T

hair

- beard & mustache growth
- male-pattern hair loss
- increased hair growth on arms, legs, back, abdomen, butt
- hair changes may take several years, & genetics are the best indicator of both hair loss & hair growth

voice

- vocal chords thicken, usually with a deepening of vocal range

body

- gradual redistribution of body fat; fat moves from thighs, buttocks & chest to stomach
- loss of layer of fat right under the skin makes muscles more visible
- muscle development (especially in upper body)
- changes in fat & muscle will reverse if T is stopped
- some guys experience changes in metabolism & hunger

skin

- acne (especially in the first few years)
- increased sweat & changes in body odor
- prominence of veins & coarser skin
- some guys go through a “puffy” or “baby fat” phase
- skin changes will reverse if testosterone is stopped

drinking lots of water can help reduce acne

what T won't do

- T will not make you taller
- T will not make your breasts disappear
- T will not grow you a typical penis or testicles

emotion

- some trans men report emotional effects such as increased aggression & inability to cry
- many trans men report a feeling of well-being, & increased energy
- emotional changes will reverse if T is stopped

sex & genitals

- menstruation ceases for most guys on T. menses will return if T is stopped.
- a permanent enlargement of the clitoris occurs
- most trans men report an increase in sex drive upon starting T & a change in the way orgasm feels
- some trans men experience shifts in their sexual orientation (it is unclear if this is related to hormones or other factors)

note: it may still be possible to get pregnant. T is not reliable birth control

side effects

- increased risk of polycystic ovary syndrome from long term T use
- high blood pressure & risk of cardiovascular disease may be increased by testosterone
- liver function is affected
- possible increased risk of bone density loss (osteoporosis)

how much is too much?

Everyone's body and genetic makeup is different. The right dose for someone else might not be right for you. Taking more testosterone than your body can process increases the risk of side effects and does not speed up transition. In fact, excess testosterone may be converted to estrogen & actually slow medical transition.

- ½ package of jalapeno peppers

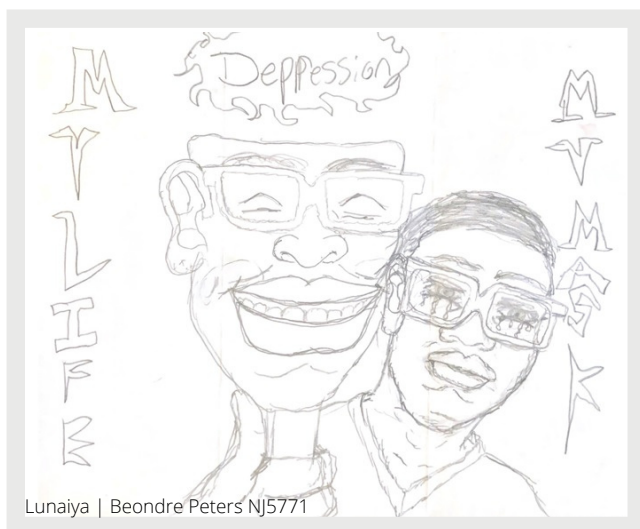

BOOKS & PENPAL RESOURCES

Books Through Bars provides small packages of free books to individuals incarcerated in PA, NJ, DE, NY, MD, and VA. Due to the pandemic they are currently prioritizing requests from PA. **Ithaca College Books Thru Bars** and **Providence Books Thru Bars** send free books nationwide. **Book 'Em** sends free educational books and quality reading material to prisoners and prison libraries in PA. **Books For Prisoners at UCSD** and **East Bay Prisoner Support** send socially conscious reading materials nationwide. **Tranzmission Prison Project** sends books to incarcerated LGBTQ folks nationwide. **Prisoners Literature Project** ships free books to every state except TX. **Prison Library Project** ships free books to all states except HI, ME, and MI.

Send a letter that includes your name, ID number, full address, any restrictions on incoming books, and types of books wanted. Make your request by subject rather than specific title or author, and provide several areas of interest if possible. For example, African-American history, basic math, carpentry, how to draw.

Please be patient. These programs get many requests, it may take a while.

Black & Pink, **Montreal Prisoner Correspondence Project**, and **Midwest Trans Prisoner Pen Pal Project** are pen pal organizations that match incarcerated members of the LGBT community anywhere in the country (and in Canada).

Additionally, there are several state organizations. The **Sylvia Rivera Law Project** corresponds with transgender people incarcerated in New York state, and the **Transgender, Gender Variant & Intersex Justice Project** supports trans and intersex people incarcerated in CA - their resource guide *A Transgender/Gender Nonconforming Guide to Parole Preparation* may be available beyond California.

Hearts on a Wire appears on several resource lists as a pen pal organization. While we are aware how valuable it can be to have contact with people, this has never been a service we have provided, nor is it something we have the capacity to take on. Hearts has worked to correct these wishful-thinking resource guides as we become aware of them, but we continue to get frequent requests for pen pal matching.

Pennsylvania Institutional Law Project provides assistance to incarcerated or institutionalized people whose constitutional rights have been violated within the institution.

Mazzoni Center has legal services for LGBT people in Pennsylvania, including discrimination cases.

Pennsylvania Innocence Project only takes on direct appeal and PCRA cases from factually innocent individuals incarcerated in PA who have been wrongfully convicted.

The **ACLU** sometimes takes prison conditions cases, but they are selective in which cases they take because they do “impact litigation.”

Impact litigation is strategic legal cases that have the potential to change the situation for other people in similar situations to the plaintiff.

Transgender Law Center is a national organization that takes on impact litigation related to trans rights.

Lambda Legal is a national organization that takes on impact litigation related to LGBT/HIV rights.

The **National Center for Lesbian Rights** is another national impact litigation firm that takes on impact litigation related to LGBT.

GLBTQ Legal Advocates & Defenders (GLAD) is a national organization that takes on impact litigation related to LGBT/HIV rights.

Transgender Legal Defense & Education Fund (TLDEF) is a national impact litigation firm that takes cases related to trans discrimination.
